

The Tennessee Comprehensive Assessment Program, or TCAP, is a set of statewide assessments given in Tennessee to measure students' skills and progress. Students in grades 3-8 take the Achievement Test, and high school students take End of Course exams for various subjects. Student results are categorized as below basic, basic, proficient or advanced. Students that are profi-cient or advanced are commonly considered to be at or above grade level. Subjects with fewer than 10 valid tests and/or subjects with at least 99 percent or less than 1 percent of students scoring in any one proficiency category are suppressed in accordance with federal privacy laws.

## TVAAS Composites: State of Tennessee, All Schools

For the 2015-16 school year, TVAAS composites do NOT include grades 4-8, due to suspension of testing in grades 3-8. For school districts that serve only grades K-8 and do not serve high school grades, 2015-16 TVAAS scores only include data based on middle school students who took End-of-Course assessments for high school-level courses (e.g. Algebra I), and where applicable, first and second grade data based on the optional K-2 assessment.

The Tennessee Value-Added Assessment System (TVAAS) is a statistical analysis used to measure the impact of districts, schools and teachers on the academic progress rates of groups of students from year-to-year. The TVAAS Composites listed here are scores that assess growth at the school or district level based on student performance on statewide assess-ments across all available subjects and grades. For districts that opted to test students in grades K-2 in years in which they are available, those scores are included in the composite.

TVAAS Composites are reported on a 1-5 scale and are one-year scores. Levels 4 and 5 indicate that a district or school is exceeding the expected growth, Level 3 indicates that they are making about the expected growth, and Levels 1 and 2 in-dicate that they are making less than the expected growth. The Overall TVAAS Composite includes all available data from the K-2 (SAT-10) assessment and from all applicable TCAP and EOC tests. ACT is a national college admissions exam that includes subject level tests in English, Math. Reading and Science. Students receive scores that range from 1 to 36 on each subject and an overall Com-posite score. All Tennessee students are required to take the ACT in 11th grade.

In 2016, ACT scores that are reported reflect the highest score per student. In previous years, the most recent score has been reported. There may be an increase when comparing past years that is due to this reporting change. These scores are for the graduating class of the selected school year.

## Graduation Rate: State of Tennessee, All Schools
